The University for International Cooperation is a non-profit organization, established in Costa Rica, since 1994.

Through its Faculty of Environment and Development, it participates in the STOREM Project, contributing its experience in issues relevant to environmental management, especially in the area of sustainable tourism. As one of the main products of this collaborative process, its Master's program in Sustainable Tourism Management will be updated.





From UCI we direct a very important component of the project, related to the establishment of an observatory focused on sustainable tourism and environmental management together with the other participating institutions.
