EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

An employment opportunities workshop was from 17-21 October 2022 at UPVM in Montpellier, France. The subject of the workshop was how to create employment opportunities in the environment protection field. This career opportunities workshop explored and developed themes for students' career opportunities.

The first two days of the event took place at the Grande Motte Convention Center as part of the event "Convergences Touristiques 2023". This large-scale event consisted of a meeting of the tourism sector, including universities, schools, high schools, and the public and private sector. Activities during the event included round-table disusssions from both the academic, professional and student perspectives. Specific presentations were also made by Montpellier Management University, OT Grand Avignon, and Tourisme durable au PNR des Grands Causses. The participation of private and public organizations involved during the events provided an opportunity to both disseminate STOREM and learn from experiences of needs in the workforce.

Training was provided by EU partners to establish future careers and co-supervision mechanisms. Presentations were made by various UPVM alumni as well as Prof. Jean-Charles Denain, and UPVM's apprenticeship services SAFCO and UFA. These presentations covered the themes of 'career days', demand and supply encounters, and internships graduates. Project partners participated in these discussions about best practices that favor the employability opportunities for students in the field. Overall, 41 participants were part of the events.





1. CONVERGENCES TOURISTIQUES 2023

The first two days of the employment opportunities workshop took place at the Grande Motte Convention Center as part of the event "Convergences Touristiques 2023". Through interaction with academics, professors and professionals in the public and private sector of tourism, project partners gained perspective from French stakeholders on how to create employment opportunities in the environment protection field.

"Convergences Touristiques 2023" was a large-scale event that brought multiple actors together from the tourism sector, including universities, schools, high schools, and the public and private sector. Activities during the event included round-table disusssions from both the academic, professional and student perspectives.

On day 1, a round table discussion was held on the subject of managing tourist flows, constraints and opportunities. Participants in included Gilles N'Goala (Professor at the University of Montpellier, Head of "Marketing - Sales" and "Marketing Innovation and Territories"); Cathy Sahuc (Head of Murmuration Company); Giulia David (Project Manager of the Agency for Sustainable Mediterranean Cities and Territories); Pierre Torrente (Director of the Pyrenean Tourism Campus); Nathalie Sautter (Deputy Director of the Haut Languedoc Regional Nature Park); Julie Jammes (Doctoral student – Open Tourisme Lab); and Florian Chardon (Syndicat Mixte Canigo Grand Site). This combination of experts and practitioners offered valuable experiences to the audience concerning strategies for tourism management, and how those strategies may differ from the different perspectives of the public and private sector.

Specific presentations followed by Montpellier Management University on the subject of sustainable tourism, asking the question: "what if we transformed our cities into socially acceptable smart tourism destinations?" Other presentations followed on the subject of networking and revitalization of youth structures in rural areas for tourism and development, as well as another round table discussion offering testimonies and exchanges on the tourism and leisure professions from representatives of the organizations OT Grand Avignon, Tourisme durable au PNR des Grands Causses, ADT Aude, CREPS, Pôle Communication CRTL.

Day 2 of the event deepened the discussion of employability in tourism. A round table discussion was held on the subject of future employability in the tourism sector, in which Storem project partner and UNA professor Esteban Barboza Núñez contributed progressive thoughts on how to develop curricula on touristic management from a classical service-based approach to a more holistic systemic paradigm. Other perspectives from both academics and tourism industry players included those of Xavier Borg (UPVM Professor), Claire Prost (Directrice Office de Tourisme Grand Avignon), and Laurence Calvas (Directrice Polysud). PhD student





Pongsa Kantasorn from UPVM then presented his thesis on "The Covid-19 as an indicator of dysfunction in the structuring of tourism: precariousness and the search for a path out of the crisis of the tourism workforce in Thailand in the era of sustainable tourism".

Further insight from the private sector was provided as support actions for students were presented by various organizations including CRTL Occitanie, Pôle 3D, and Occitanie Regional Directorate – INSEE. Finally, Caroline Leboucher of GIE Atout France presented their ambition of sustainable transformation projects to be carried out collectively in advance of major international sporting events that France will host in 2023 and 2024.

2. EU TRAINING SESSIONS

Continuing through days 3 and 4 of the event in Montpellier, France, activities were held at UPVM's campuses in Beziers and Montpellier with the goal of providing training to project partners on the subject of creating employment opportunities in the environment protection field. By exploring and developing themes for students' career opportunities, these training session provided valuable insights for project partners that could be applied to the new master's curricula in the STOREM pathway.

On day 3 in Beziers, presentations were made by various UPVM alumni on the subject of employability in the tourism sector. Presentations were made by Mehdi Bounab, Marie-Theres Werner and Syamak Seifi, allowing project partners to learn from the experiences presented in the south of France.

Further training was provided on day 4 by EU partners to establish future careers and co-supervision mechanisms. A presentations made by Prof. Jean-Charles Denain discussed novel strategies for integrating students in professional experiences in sustainable tourism through the development of startup incubators that connect numerical research with local socio-cultural needs. The presentation enlightened project partners on the experiences in France with academic initiatives for startup incubators.

The training session continued with UPVM's apprenticeship services SAFCO and UFA. Laurent Brandon of SAFCO described the various strategies used ate UPVM for generating apprenticeships for students and encouraging continued education for graduates. Meanwhile, Blandine Pitié of UFA detailed the approach used at UPVM's center for apprentice training and how this center has proved to increase the employability of students and graduates from the university. Other aspects of discussion covered the themes of 'career days', how to generate demand and supply encounters, and the formation of international internships for graduates.

Short description of the event:

The first day of the employment opportunities workshop took place at the Grande Motte Convention Center as part of the event "Convergences Touristiques 2023". "Convergences Touristiques 2023" was a large-scale event that brought multiple actors together from the tourism sector, including universities, schools, high schools, and the public and private sector. Activities during the event included round-table discussions from both the academic, professional and student perspectives.

On the morning, a short meeting between the partners took place in order to present the week agenda and Through interaction with academics, professors and professionals in the public and private sector of tourism, project partners gained perspective from French stakeholders on how to create employment opportunities in the environment protection field.

A round table discussion was held on the subject of managing tourist flows, constraints and opportunities. Participants in included Gilles N'Goala (Professor at the University of Montpellier, Head of "Marketing – Sales" and "Marketing Innovation and Territories"); Cathy Sahuc (Head of Murmuration Company); Giulia David (Project Manager of the Agency for Sustainable Mediterranean Cities and Territories); Pierre Torrente (Director of the Pyrenean Tourism Campus); Nathalie Sautter (Deputy Director of the Haut Languedoc Regional Nature Park); Julie Jammes (Doctoral student – Open Tourisme Lab); and Florian Chardon (Syndicat Mixte Canigo Grand Site). This combination of experts and practitioners offered valuable experiences to the audience concerning strategies for tourism management, and how those strategies may differ from the different perspectives of the public and private sector. For exemple, there were a reflexion about overtourism which can be understood in 2 ways, in an objective quantitative sense (capacity of a destination and potential saturation of the destination), and in a qualitative, subjective sense (individual and collective perception: emotional and behavioral responses, manifestation, tourismophobia)

Specific presentations followed by Montpellier Management University on the subject of sustainable tourism, asking the question: "what if we transformed our cities into socially acceptable smart tourism destinations?". In the long term, intelligent tourist destinations will become more and more important and we must invest in order to reconcile the economy and sustainability, but we must also integrate the social issue.







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Other presentations followed on the subject of networking and revitalization of youth structures in rural areas for tourism and development, as well as another round table discussion offering testimonies and exchanges on the tourism and leisure professions from representatives of the organizations OT Grand Avignon, Tourisme durable au PNR des Grands Causses, ADT Aude, CREPS, Pôle Communication CRTL.

Students of different masters – including two students from the UPVM Master Tourism and sustainable development of territories" shared their synthesis of the day.

Short description of event planning problems:

There were some problems with Wi-Fi connection. We faced some real time translation problems. In the second session of the day, students of the Master on Sustainable Tourism from UPVM translated into English and Spanish the presentations.

Main outcomes of the event:

- Recognize the importance of behavioral sciences. Knowing and understanding behavior in order to manage flows and make decisions.
- These problems are shared throughout the world. It is therefore necessary to cross disciplines and the data collected.
- Raise awareness.
- Accompany change through education and transparent communication.
- Involve the residents who live in the area.

Short description of the event:

Day 2 of the event also took place at the Grande Motte Convention Center as part of the event "Convergences Touristiques 2023". "Convergences Touristiques 2023" was a large-scale event that brought multiple actors together from the tourism sector, including universities, schools, high schools, and the public and private sector. Activities during the event included round-table discussions from both the academic, professional and student perspectives.

Day 2 deepened the discussion of employability in tourism. A round table discussion was held on the subject of future employability in the tourism sector in which Storem project partner and UNA professor Esteban Barboza Núñez contributed progressive thoughts on how to develop curricula on touristic management from a classical service-based approach to a more holistic systemic paradigm. Other perspectives from both academics and tourism industry players included those of Xavier Borg (UPVM Professor), Claire Prost (Directrice Office de Tourisme Grand Avignon), and Laurence Calvas (Directrice Polysud).

This was an opportunity to think about training in line with the position to be filled and the skills to be acquired: Improve your technical skills, Deepen your knowledge, Optimize your know-how. The round table and discussions also exposed the elements of continuing education: the Training Account (CFP) (right to train, a service mandated by the Ministry of Labour); Pôle emploi, which finances training; and the Skills Operators (OPCO) whose mission is to ensure the financing of apprenticeship and professionalization contracts, according to the levels of coverage set by the professional branches; to provide technical support to the professional branches, to ensure a local service for the benefit of very small, small and medium-sized enterprises in particular. During this round table,

PhD student Pongsa Kantasorn from UPVM (direction: Dominique Crozat and Gwenn Pulliat) then presented his thesis on "The Covid-19 as an indicator of dysfunction in the structuring of tourism: precariousness and the search for a path out of the crisis of the tourism workforce in Thailand in the era of sustainable tourism".

Further insight from the private sector was provided as support actions for students were presented by various organizations including CRTL Occitanie, Pôle 3D, and Occitanie Regional Directorate – INSEE.







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Special presentation about how understanding, measuring and analyzing the touristic economic sector in Occitanie region, as well as the transformations, indicators and tools to be used.

Finally, Caroline Leboucher of GIE Atout France presented their ambition of sustainable transformation projects to be carried out collectively in advance of major international sporting events that France will host in 2023 and 2024.

- -lack of capability to diversify or find new employment in the tourism field

Avenues of reflection on these subjects:

- -access to education and training (long and short term programs)
- -policy support (international and national levels)
- -social protection programs specific to the tourism field

The advice was to visit the areas often, interview locals about the projects, share food and traditions. If you sense a conflict, you must resolve it before it becomes too important. It's a long strategy, several years, but it's paying off.

Luis Dávila and Rafael García presented the master program in sustainable tourism management at Unimagdalena (with the question of scholarships to teachers who want to specialize in tourism.

The touristic little train of Béziers which goes to the Fonseranes 9 Locks on the Canal du Midi is not working during low season, so there were not public or private transportation to go and visit the Heritage Site and the travel time was a bit long.

Afternoon: visit of The Fonseranes 9 Locks on the Canal du Midi

In the twentieth century the Fonséranes Lock shared with the entire Canal du Midi the passage from commercial tool to tourist attraction. Since then, the lock has been celebrated and recognized as a heritage site, both at national and international level. However, full awareness of its tourist potential was shown more in promotional strategies than in management on the ground. Until 2015, problems in accessibility, lack of safety and poor infrastructure negatively impact on the tourist experience. The site was renovated in 2016 with a project which aims to offer a quality tourist experience through a sustainable valorization, but still leaves some problems unresolved.
