Abstract	<p>The concluding conference of the STOREM Project was held from 1-5 November 2022 at the Nicoya Campus of the National University (UNA) in Costa Rica. This event was held to disseminate the final project results, curricula, details and outcomes. The event began with a partnership development activity at the nearby Liberia campus where experts from UNA and EAFIT presented their experience with water research as it pertains to sustainable tourism and environmental protection. On day 2, UNA celebrated the official inauguration of its new master's program in tourism and sustainable tourism, attended by the university's Rector, Dean of Faculty, professors and students of the new program. Following, project partners presented all of the project outcomes and lessons learned. Finally, visits were carried out at the nearby sustainable tourism sites of Peninsula Papagayo and the Barra Honda National Park. Overall, these events were attended by 83 participants, included 17 research presentation and generated 4 press notes.</p>

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

From 1-5 November 2022, the concluding conference of the STOREM Project was held in Costa Rica. The event was carried out primarily at the Nicoya Campus of the National University (UNA), with additional side events at the Liberia Campus and nearby sites for sustainable tourism. The objective of the event was to disseminate all of the project's final results, curricula, details and outcomes.

Additionally, the event was combined with the official inauguration of UNA's new master's program in tourism and sustainable tourism. The inauguration was attended by the university's Rector, Dean of Faculty and professors. Many students also attended, including those students registered in the new master's program as.

A side event for partnership development was carried out at the nearby Liberia campus. During this activity, experts from UNA and EAFIT presented their experience with water research as it pertains to sustainable tourism and environmental protection. Following, the technical activities to be included in a Framework Agreement between the two universities were drafted.

The remained of the event focused on presentations made by project partners of all of the project outcomes and lessons learned. These included the new curricula at



each HEI, research in the scope of the developed observatories, and case studies. These presentations gave the opportunity for a final review of all activities carried out and to give closure to the project.

In order to share experiences and lessons learned from local activities in sustainable tourism, a visit was carried out to the Papagayo Peninsula where project partners observed the sustainability program being implemented with three 5-star hotels, as well as the eco-tourism activities of the nearby Eco-Camping Resort. Another visit was done at the Barra Honda National Park where project partners learned of efforts to increase the participation of local communities and women in sustainable tourism activities.

Dissemination of the event included 4 press notes, multiple posters, and photography coverage. Overall, these events were attended by 83 participants and included 17 research presentations.

1. DEVELOPMENT OF HEI SYNERGIES

On day 1 of the event, a partnership development activity was carried out at the Liberia Campus of UNA. This workshop was focused on creating synergies between higher education institutes working on similar themes which could form the basis for the development of future international observatories in the framework of the STOREM project. During these sessions, participants analyzed indicators associated with environmental protection, sustainable tourism, and environmental policy, among others.

Of particular interest were hydrological indicators which are associated with flooding, droughts, coastal erosion, water quality, and the El Niño/La Niña phenomena, as critical factors associated with the protection of the natural environment and touristic infrastructure. Based on these exploratory discussions, participants discussed how hydrological indicators can be incorporated into the framework of international observatories, such as those developed through the STOREM Project. Technical presentations were made by Dr. Juan D. Restrepo, and Dr. Marko Tosić of EAFIT University on their hydrological research in the Magdalena River watershed and Cartagena Bay in Colombia. On behalf of UNA, Dr. Andrea Suárez, Dr. Christian Golcher and MSc. William Gómez presented an overview of the hydrological research being done at UNA's HIDROCEC and CEMEDE.

Future actions for the development of these ideas by HEI project partners were defined in order to create a Framework Agreement between UNA and EAFIT. The objective was to coordinate in order to achieve sustainability in the progress made

by the project on observatories during the past years (2018-2022), to develop an action plan for future observatories in collaboration with STOREM project partners, and ultimately contribute to the continuity and strengthening of the project's observatories for sustainable tourism and environmental protection.

2. INAUGURATION OF THE MASTER IN TOURISM AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

On day 2, UNA celebrated the inauguration of its new master's program in tourism and sustainable tourism. The inauguration was attended by the university's Rector, Dean of Faculty and professors. Many students also attended, including those students registered in the new master's program as.

Welcome words were given by MEd. Francisco Gonzales Alvarado, Rector of Universidad Nacional (UNA); MEd. Wagner Castro Castillo, Dean of the Sede Regional Chorotega, UNA; Dr. Anna Pinna, STOREM Project Coordinator, Universidad de Cagliari (UNICA); and Dr. Juan Carlos Picón Cruz, Coordinator of the Master's Program in Tourism and Sustainable Development, UNA.

A research presentation was then delivered by Dr. Alexandre Panosso Netto, Professor at the School of Art, Sciences and Humanities of the University of Sao Paulo, Brazil, and visiting scholar at UNA. Dr. Panosso discussed postgraduate studies for tourism development in Latin America and the Caribbean from a global perspective.

Two of the currently enrolled students in UNA's new master's program then gave research presentations as well. First, Lic. Walter Enrique Torres Melendez, the Regional Director of the Costa Rican Tourism Institute presented the National Tourism Development Plan and Applications in the Chorotega Region. Following, MSc. Edgar Eduardo Quirós Porras, an independent professional, presented work on urban-maritime planning for the prevention of natural disasters in the Samara Nosara area.

The event was concluded with comments from Dr. Raffaele Pacci of UNICA, Italy. Dr. Pacci's address focused on positive reflections of the new master's program at UNA along the Storem pathway of sustainable tourism and environmental protection.



3. CONCLUDING CONFERENCE

The concluding conference of the STOREM project focused on presentations made by project partners of all of the project outcomes and lessons learned. These included the new curricula at each HEI, research in the scope of the developed observatories, and case studies. These presentations gave the opportunity for a final review of all activities carried out and to give closure to the project. The event was organized by each of the 4 specific objectives of the STOREM Project.

Objective 1: Design and development of new programs of master's curricula

Presentations were made on behalf of each project partner in the Caribbean. Dr. Alfonso Lara Quesada reviewed the background and achievements of STOREM at the UNA and recapped the recently inaugurated new master's program in tourism and sustainable development. Juleith Lizcano presented the new master's program in Sustainable Tourism Management at UniMagdalena. Dr. Juan Darío Restrepo presented the two new courses at EAFIT: 1) Watershed Management for Environmental Protection, and 2) Coastal Management for Sustainable Beach Tourism. Dr. Janice Cumberbatch presented on behalf of UWI, Barbados, about their two new courses: 1) Disaster Risk and Resilience in Caribbean Tourism, and 2) Sustainable Tourism in the Coastal Zone. Finally, MSc. Gloriana Reyes presented the update of the new courses of the master's degree in sustainable tourism management of the University for International Cooperation (UCI) in Costa Rica.

Objective 2: Development of an interaction model between higher education institutions and private and public actors (employment opportunities)

Discussions of the second objective were led by Dr. Dominique Crozat of Paul Valéry University Montpellier (UPVM) in France. Dr. Crozat detailed how an interaction model between higher education institutions and private and public actors has been beneficial to the work of UPVM in the southern French coastal area. By developing such an interaction model, the EU experts have succeeded in generating employment opportunities for their students and generating synergies between higher education institutions and private and public actors.

Objective 3: Establishment of Observatories on Sustainable Tourism and Environmental Protection

The three observatories generated by the STOREM project were presented by representatives of Unimagdalena, EAFIT, UPD, UCI and UNA. On behalf of Unimagdalena, MSc. Marla Maestre presented the university's new ecosystem for sustainable tourism. By developing an innovative E-Learning platform (Bloque 10), students have access to all of their course content and materials online, and also benefit from the space to interact with other students and their professors.

Dr. Marko Totic of EAFIT presented the Cartagena Bay Observatory. This E-Learning system forecasts the water conditions of the bay in real-time, providing valuable information for touristic beaches and marine ecosystems which all depend on adequate water quality. This E-Learning software has been designed to support HEI curricula, stakeholders, decision-makers, and vulnerable communities, as is publicly available online.

Matteo Bellinzas of the Unidad de Planificación y Desarrollo (UPD) presented the STOREM Observatories for Sustainable Tourism and Environmental Protection (O-STEPs). O-STEP compiles the observatory data provided by all of the Caribbean HEIs, and thus creates a space to store, house and disseminate the different results on sustainable tourism. Matteo also discussed strategies for the project's sustainability and cooperation among partners.

MSc. Allan Valverde of UCI presented progress in the implementation of the UCI observatory. This work focuses on conservations efforts made in national parks in Costa Rica in collaboration with public authorities and local stakeholders. The work exhibits innovative strategies to monitor the status of animal populations through audio recordings from hidden microphones which can then calculate and monitor populations.

Dr. Esteban Barboza presented UNA's observatory for tourism, migrations, and sustainability. Hosted by the Chortega Campus, this observatory collects and stores socioeconomic data of tourists, the local population and their employment within the tourist sector. The novel approach presented to the applications of socioeconomic data provide a showcase to the future benefits that such observatories can have for society, management and decision making.

Objective 4: Strengthen the peace process promoting higher education and opportunities for inclusion in the labor market for displaced populations

To finalize the event, the project's work in supporting vulnerable populations was presented by UPD and UniMagdalena. On behalf of UPD, MSc. Lisa Presciani presented the activities of STOREM that support for vulnerable communities and internally displaced people (IDPs). Lisa showed how this work's results can lead to opportunities for future development strategies.

On behalf of UniMagdalena, Dr. Julieth Lizcano presented the Colombian university's efforts in supporting vulnerable populations. This initiative includes the promotion of scholarships for IDPs and vulnerable populations in the new master's program at UniMagdalena. Dr. Lizcano also highlights how their new master's program is leveraged to articulate with the territory as a strategy for inclusion and higher education promotion in tourism.

4. SYNERGIES OF PUBLIC-PRIVATE ALLIANCE WITH PROJECTS OF TOURIST DEVELOPMENTS

A visit was carried out to the Peninsula Papagayo with which UNA has generated an alliance. The objective of the alliance is to contribute to the formation of human capital in the region by providing economic support to applicants with limited economic conditions and with academic potential through a scholarship fund for the master's degree in "tourism and sustainable development" at the National University of Costa Rica.

Peninsula Papagayo belongs to the Tourist Pole of the Gulf of Papagayo, a development created by Law 6758: Regulatory Law for the Development and Execution of the Project Tourist Gulf of Papagayo. The Tourist Pole is located in the province of Guanacaste, between the district of Nacascolo in the canton of Liberia to the north and the district of Sardinal in the canton of Carrillo to the south. It is the main planned tourist pole in the country with an approximate area of 1,658 hectares. Peninsula Papagayo, since its inception, works to fulfill its objectives under a philosophy that combines these four pillars: respect for national legislation, quality, respect for the environment and strengthening of community relations. Peninsula Papagayo is known worldwide for being a tourism project of five-star hotels and mixed use, which, since its inception, has operated under strict principles of sustainability.

Of particular interest will be hydrological indicators which are associated with flooding, droughts, coastal erosion, water quality, and the El Niño/La Niña phenomena, as critical factors associated with the protection of the natural environment and touristic infrastructure. Based on these exploratory discussions, participants will contemplate how hydrological indicators can be incorporated into the framework of international observatories, such as those developed through the STOREM Project. Future actions for the development of these ideas by HEI project partners will be defined and coordinated in order to achieve sustainability in the progress made by the project on observatories during the past years (2018-2022), to develop an action plan for future observatories in collaboration with STOREM project partners, and ultimately contribute to the continuity and strengthening of the project's observatories for sustainable tourism and environmental protection.

- (i) share a common ground for debate, with some common indicators to pursue its own identity, allowing confrontation with the STOREM, ensuring context-based research and policy evaluations by each territory;
 - (ii) connect with different actors in each territory (bioregional approach, contact with the political sector, local communities, entrepreneurs, experts, and the tourism sector in general);
 - (iii) strengthen interdisciplinary dialogue, allowing the academic community to share the different methodologies and approaches offered by each territory.
- Support policy making;
• Promote research-based research;
• Foster and promote mutual learning and knowledge exchange.




